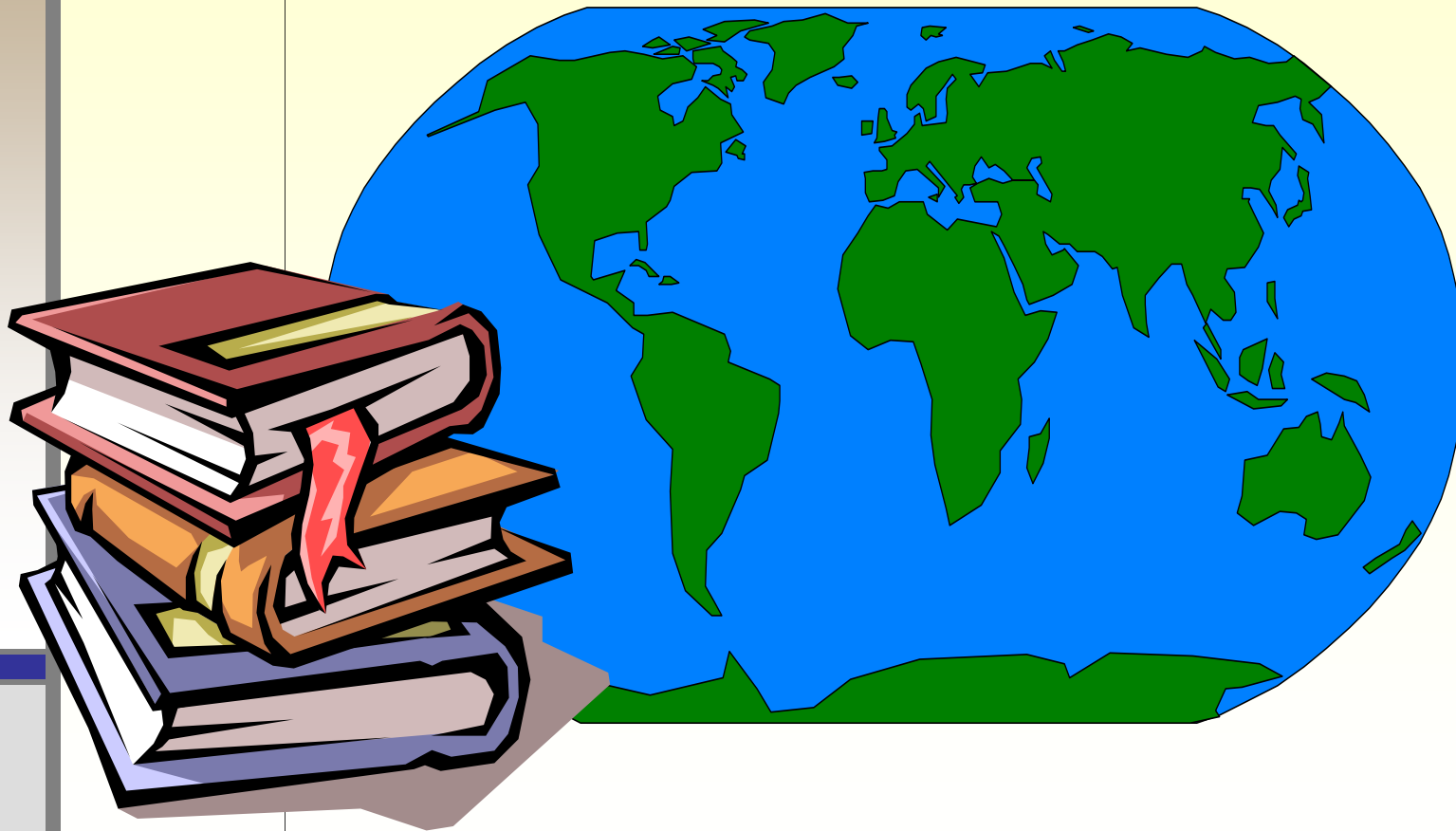

- ❑ Compiled from branches of international law & applied to migration issues
- ❑ Different instruments apply depending upon context
